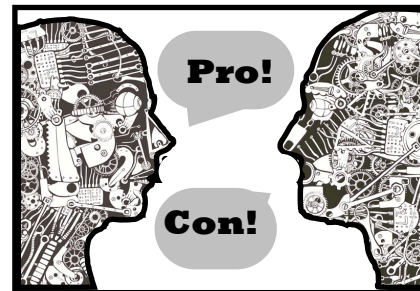

Three recommended databases

Opposing Viewpoints

Opposing Viewpoints in Context offers 6600+ topic overviews, 20,000+ pro/con viewpoint articles; 19,000+ reference articles that provide context; 5 million full-text articles from magazines, academic journals, and newspapers; multimedia; primary source documents; government and organizational statistics; and links to carefully selected outside websites.

Issues & Controversies

In-depth investigations of today's top issues explore more than 800 hot topics in business, politics, education, government, and popular culture. The database provides the latest Reuters news coverage, chronologies, maps, tables, keywords, Bloomberg videos, editorials, and contact information.

CQ Researcher

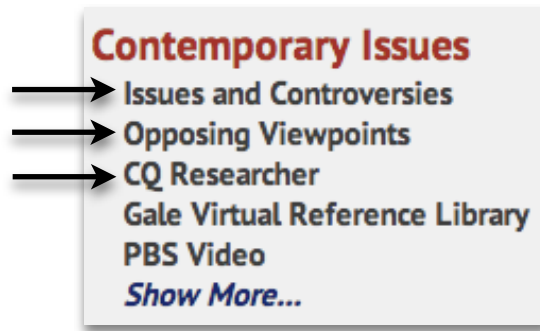
Congressional Quarterly includes in-depth reports on current issues. Each 12,000-word report includes an introduction and overview, background and chronology on the topic, an assessment of the current situation, tables and maps, and pro/con statements from representatives of opposing positions.

✓ *Looking for a research topic? Select **Browse Topics** or **Browse Reports** at the top of the home page.*

1. Start at the Library's home page: lib.gccaz.edu/lmc

2. Click **Library Databases**, located on the left of the search box.

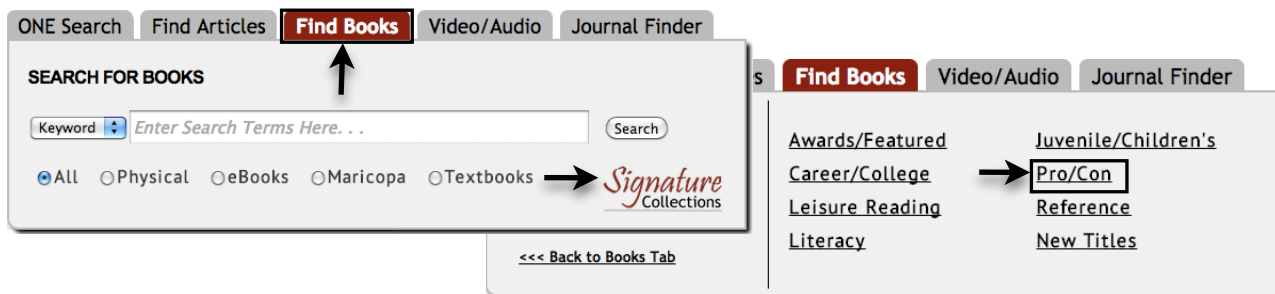
3. Find the **Contemporary Issues** category in the **Databases by Subject** list. Search for your topic in the top three databases on the list. All three provide links to browse lists of topic ideas. If you're not on campus, log in with your MEID and password.



4. All three databases offer citations in both MLA and APA formats. Copy and paste them into your Works Cited list to save time. **Important tip: These citations are machine generated and are often inaccurate. Take time to carefully check them!**

Want to find a Pro/Con book with viewpoints about your topic?

From the Library's home page, click the **Find Books** tab. Click **Signature Collections** on the lower right side and select **Pro/Con**. The PROCON books are shelved on the Pro/Con table next to the Reference Desk.
