#### Basic format, no author:

Article title. (Year, month date). *Magazine title, vol*, pages.

### Basic format, no author:

Article title. (Year, month date). *Newspaper title*, pp. page#.

# Daily news article with author, discontinuous pages (example):

Gordon, J. (1993, September 30). Obesity affects economic, social status. *The Washington Post*, pp. A1, A4.

# Daily newspaper article, no author, continuous pages (example):

Gulf oil spill takes toll on local fishermen. (2010, July 15). *Biloxi Chronicle*, pp. A2-A3.

Author's name. (Year of publication). Article title. *Journal title, volume number* (issue number), page numbers.

#### **Basic format (with DOI):**

Author's name. (Year of publication). Article title. *Journal title, volume number* (issue number), page numbers. doi: #######

#### **Basic format (electronic without DOI):**

Author's name. (Year of publication). Article title. *Journal title, volume number* (issue number), page numbers. Retrieved from http://url\_to\_full\_article

[Note: To cite an **entire website** it is sufficient to include the website address as an in-text citation only. However, if you reference a <u>specific</u> document or piece of information from the website, then use the format listed below so readers can connect to relevant content.]

### Basic Format, web doc or web page (electronic):

Author name(s). (Date of publication). Title of page/article. Retrieved from http://www.somesitetocite.com/pageordoc

#### **Basic Format, blog (electronic):**

Author/Screen name. (Date of publication). Title of post [Post format]. Retrieved from http://www.siteadress.com

## Entire website, in-text (example from APA blog):

#### Web document, non-periodical (example):

If the interview <u>can</u> be recovered and is available as an audio file or through a transcript, then you will need to create both an in-text citation and reference entry.]

Last name, Initial. (Interviewer) & Last name, Initial. (Interviewee). (Year of interview). *Title of interview* [Accessed medium such as Interview transcript or Audio file]. Retrieved from Name of Collection or Web site: http://www.url\_to\_file

#### **Recoverable interview, electronic (example):**

Holmes, S. (Interviewer) & Watson, R. (Interviewee). (1999). Deductive logic [Interview transcript]. Retrieved from Oral Histories of Baker Street Project Web site: http://www.someaddress.com
