
Gun Control and the 2nd Amendment: Library Research Guide

Take a look at the shelves in both the Reference and General collections in these three areas:

- → E = History of the Americas. E310-E337 covers the Constitutional period in the United States.
- **→ HV** = Criminology. Look for gun control on the **HV7435-HV7439** shelves.
- → KF = United States law. KF3941 is the section for the history of firearms law. Browse the KF4501-5130 section for Constitutional law.
