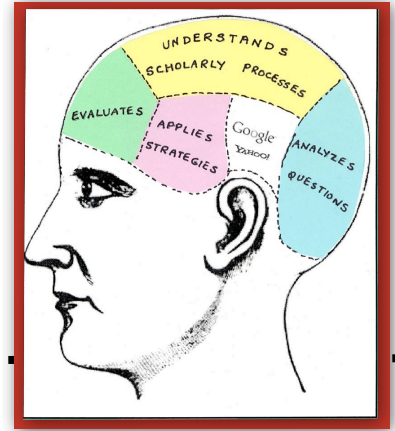

Working on a research project for your psychology class? Explore these three useful psychology databases:

- **PsycARTICLES** - This database from the American Psychological Association has 26,000+ articles originally published in 42 peer-reviewed psychology journals between 1988 and the present. This database is recommended for scholarly, refereed, and peer reviewed articles.
- **Psychology and Behavioral Sciences Collection** taps into 500 full-text journals, most of which are peer-reviewed. Its coverage of child and adolescent psychology is particularly strong. Coverage of emotional and behavioral characteristics, psychiatry and psychology, mental processes, anthropology, and observational and experimental methods also is emphasized.
- **EBSCOhost Psychology Databases** - Search both the PsycARTICLES and the Psychology and Behavioral Science Collection databases simultaneously!

Getting started

Begin at is.gd/gcclib, a shortcut to lib.gccaz.edu/lmc. Click the **Library Databases** link next to the search box.

Locate the **Psychology** section in the **Database Subjects** list.

Interested in going further? Want to find **even more** online material? Search these databases, located in the **General/All Subjects** and **General Reference** categories at the top of the **Databases by Subject** page:

- **Academic Search Premier** - Articles cover many areas of academic study.
- **JSTOR** - Scholarly articles provide in-depth information. (*Tip: Save time when you're reviewing your search results and choose the **Article PDF** view option.*)
- **Credo Reference** - This is a collection of 600+ subject encyclopedias and specialized

dictionaries that will introduce your topic. (*Tip: Look at the word count for articles.*)

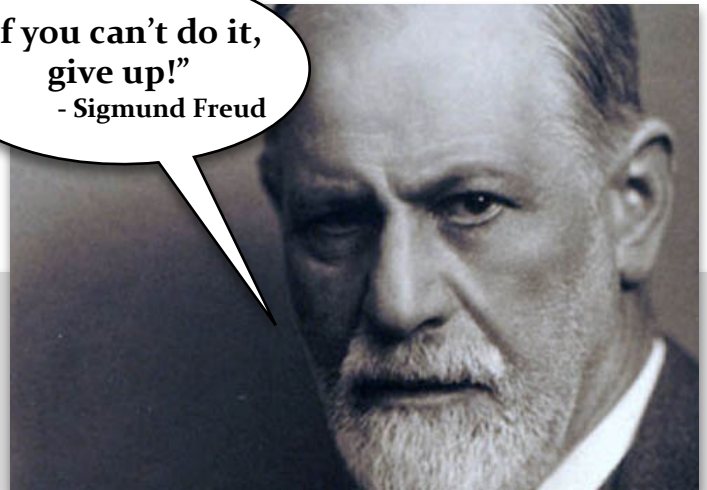
